ABOUT CIRCULAR TERRITORIES

The webinar Circular Territories is organised in the framework of the Conference XXIII Jornadas Internacionales de Patrimonio Industrial, organised from 29 September to 2 October 2021 by Miguel Álvarez Areces, director of the INCUNA association. It is part of a series of events including workshops, laboratories, and webinars organised on the topics of the conference. The contributions will be published as part of the Conference proceedings edited by Cicees.

Circular Territories promotes a debate between experts, entrepreneurs, activists, and researchers contributing to many relevant topics such as circular economy, urban and rural development, agritech, food cycles, social innovation, arts, heritage and culture. Circular Territories is part of the research framework Medways initiated by Mosè Ricci at the Accademia dei Lincei in Italy.

The webinar discusses **new concepts and horizons** on how urban and rural vibrancy, innovation, technology and creativity reshape cultural spaces and resources. The webinar showcases avant-garde examples of policy, initiatives and successful urban and regional development, and their **impact on society, business and cultural heritage** in the context of **towns, villages, and rural areas**.

The webinar is organised in three sessions:

CIRCULAR ECONOMY AND CREATIVE INDUSTRIES

It is becoming increasingly clear that a linear model of resource consumption can no longer be followed and circularity has to play an important role in the development of a sustainable future. New innovative technology, more efficient solutions and reforms in industrial policy are required to improve the productivity of resources, and to recycle and reduce the waste in production and consumption processes. High-tech solutions, new perspectives and designs for utilising waste products are renewing the agricultural world. Food is becoming a source of new sustainable energies, a material for new products, an element of innovation and new creative and resilient cycles. New companies and creative industries have invested in the development of a new future by promoting circular solutions for recycling and the use of local resources. This session will focus on circular economy projects, experiences and interventions that encourage creative transformation processes based on new technologies able to renew productivity in a territorial context.

The main keywords of this session are: food, new creative cycles & agritech.

SOCIAL INNOVATION AND URBAN HERITAGE

Contemporary urban areas and local resources are affected by episodes of abandonment and disuse. Urban planners and architects have examined experiences of reactivating such sites and addressed these problems by adopting new socially innovative strategies. Indeed, social innovation encourages practices that respond to the social and spatial problem by creating innovative solutions for the community and enhancing the value of assets in the long term. These practices generate a new sense of belonging to the place and develop a wide network of local activists and associations able to promote structural impact and economic growth. At the heart of the debate are social enterprises and non-profit entities who want to create social benefits, new cultural opportunities and economic solutions that make better use of local resources. Heritage plays a central role in this as it provides the space for community participation and builds social awareness which can activate processes of reappropriation and reactivation. This session focuses on social innovation in the heritage of urban settlements, where public participation and social enterprises play an important role in the regeneration process.

The main keywords of this session are: social innovation, heritage, urban and territorial regeneration.

CULTURAL URBANISM AND SUSTAINABLE INNOVATION

In a contemporary world affected by a global pandemic and climate change, the development of **urban and rural areas** plays an important role in the creation a sustainable future. **Resilient approaches** are needed to transform spaces and products that trigger ecological, economic, and socio-cultural sustainability and promote **new responsible behaviours and actions**. At the heart of the debate are initiatives that encourage **sustainable interventions** in creative ways. **Art, culture, sustainable urban and territorial design** play an important role in developing **new trajectories** for the future development of space, especially for peripheral areas. Innovative and **creative projects** reshape places, enhance local resources and create new economic possibilities, and new forms of work. This session focuses on projects policies, and programmes that aim to develop **new lifestyles in urban and rural areas**.

The main keywords of this session are sustainability, arts, urban and territorial design, culture, lifestyles and behaviours.
